

Jan T. Gross studies modern Europe, focusing on comparative politics, totalitarian and authoritarian regimes, Soviet and East European politics, and the Holocaust. In 2007, Professor Gross published a book on anti-Semitism in Poland after World War II, and in 2009 he coauthored a study with Stephen Kotkin entitled "Uncivil Society: Communist Implosion in 1989". Professor Gross's latest book, Golden Harvest, is on plunder of Jews by the local population in Nazi-occupied Europe.
