How Juan Perón became a Friend of the Americans: The New Washington-Buenos Aires Axis, 1970-1975

From the late 1960s through the early 1970s, the U.S. government has been reasonably tied to a pro-dictatorship foreign policy in Latin America with special reference to Washington's role in the overthrow of Salvador Allende in Chile. However, In relations with Argentina -- through the brief final presidency of long-time pariah Juan Peron -- U.S. leaders and policy makers proved surprisingly accommodating and even welcoming of what had troubled them before September 1973 in Chile -- a strong shift to the "left" on dependency theory-inspired socio-economic polices all of which Washington hoped would bring stability to an increasingly chaotic Argentine polity.
